ARcare is a system of over 40 clinics in Arkansas, Kentucky and Mississippi serving people with or without insurance.

One of the many services we offer is our HIV Program, serving people living with HIV throughout the entire state of Arkansas and funded by Ryan White and the AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP).



## Ryan White

Ryan White and ADAP (AIDS Drug Assistance Program) are federally funded grant programs for people living with HIV (PLWH) who lack sufficient healthcare coverage or the resources to cope with an HIV diagnosis.

The Ryan White Program works with agencies in all fifty states to provide services to more than half a million people each year.

## Services may include:

- ◆ Core Medical Services
- ◆ Mental Health Care
- ◆ Substance Abuse Counseling
- ◆ Oral Health Care
- ◆ Medical Transportation Assistance

- ◆ Medication Co-Pay Assistance
- ◆ Support Groups
